The NAACS Fellowship


NAACS offers a comprehensive one to two-year fellowship program designed for founding school teams who are committed to opening an autism-focused charter school. Teams will visit NAACS Demonstration Sites in Arizona and Florida four times during the school year to be immersed in a scope of training within an active autism school setting. The goal will be to equip founding teams to lead an evidence based autism focused charter school that is compliant with public charter laws.
